- 3. Entries must be postmarked on or before February 1, 2023 and 2024 to your District Environment chairman. Each club may submit a limit of 2 entries. Each contestant must sign a contest release form found in the GFWC/Ohio Federation of Women's Club's Directory.

On the back of the essay you must include the following information:

Title of work, Student's name, parent or legal guardian's name and telephone number, email, name of student's school, city or town in which the school is located and sponsoring club's name, City and District and mailing address. Print legibly or use Times New Roman 11 font.

General Information:

District winners will receive certificates on Legislation Day. First place winners will also receive \$15.00 from GFWC/Ohio Federation of Women's Clubs and be entered in the state competition. The Woman's Town Club – One Hundred Years!

The Springfield City Federation of Women's Clubs includes a number of member clubs that have existed for many years. Today we proudly announce **The Woman's Town Club** has been affiliated with the City Federation from the very beginning.

The 100th Anniversary of **The Woman's Town Club** will be celebrated officially on December 4, 2022, at the home. This is the culmination of many events that were held throughout this year including an ice cream social, a wine tasting party, and a raffle for an 1890's dinner for 10 guests. The dinner raffle was won by Mary Ann Jung, the current President of TRIAD CLUB/GFWC and a Past President of the City Federation. It was a wonderful step back in history with great food!

This 805 East High Street historic home, now known as the Town Club, was the residence of Clementine and Edward Buchwalter when Clementine founded the Ohio Federation of Women's Clubs in October 1894. It is the location where the bronze Clementine Berry Buchwalter Statue, that was dedicated in 2005, sits on the East lawn welcoming guests to her former home in Springfield.

The Woman's Town Club mission is to provide a social center for citizens in the Springfield area and to maintain the preservation of this gracious historical home. The Woman's Town Club, Home of the Buchwalter House, is now a 501(c)3 organization, providing a tax-exempt opportunity for everyone to help with their mission. Various types of events are held at the club throughout the year and the funds raised from these events are used to support the maintenance and restoration of the home.

When she was alive, Clementine Berry Buchwalter generously offered her home as a meeting place for women and in 1922 her husband made her wishes known again. Edward Buchwalter made it possible for the home to provide a center for social and civic activities in Springfield.

The Woman's Town Club membership works very hard to care for our Founder's former home and where numerous gifts of furniture and china dishes donated from the Buchwalter Family are on display. Your club may want to plan a trip to our Founder's home in Springfield and enjoy a luncheon in the Tea Room while visiting this historic site.
